Right now many people differentiate between civil war refugees and poverty refugees. Where the first ones are treated with a general understanding of their problem the poverty refugees are supposed to leave again rather quickly.

Due to the Dublin Regulation that made refugees have to stay in the country they first arrived in, the countries at external european borders shut down their help for the arriving refugees thus making the pressure on countries like Germany, Austria and Sweden that still took up refugees much higher which also raised the already existing sorrows of the citizens

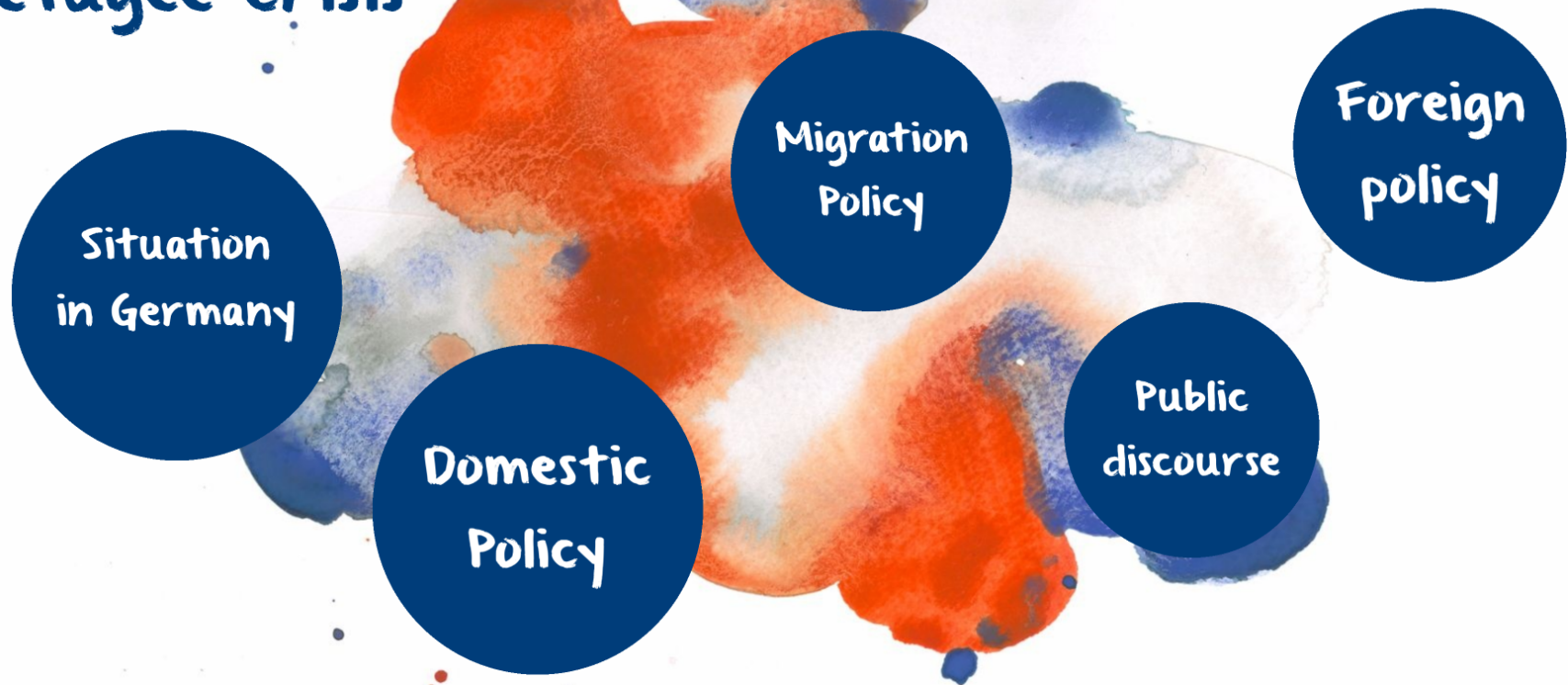
